66 texts from 66 books

On September 4 we will start a new sermon series, "66 Texts from 66 Books." Over the course of the next year we will read and contemplate at least one section from every book of the Bible. Why?

We normally follow a 3-year rotation of scripture lessons (called a lectionary), reading one lesson from the Old Testament, a New Testament epistle, and a Gospel lesson. It is a wonderful way to experience the breadth and depth of the Scriptures. But even with all of those lessons, we still don't read from 9 books of the Bible, and there are many other lessons that we never get a chance to read. This year we will read something from every book, with a focus on stories and lessons that aren't in our normal lectionary. If you want to do some extra reading, we will include a note in the Chapel Chatter with a list of readings from the three-year lectionary for you to read and explore on your own, in addition to other texts that might apply to the chosen lesson for that Sunday.

My prayer is that this series will challenge us to dig deeper into scripture and help us listen to all that God has to say to us through His Word.
