

SCRIPTURE READING Zephaniah 3:1-2, 7-13

Fear is a natural response to many things, especially when we have done something wrong and know that consequences are coming! Zephaniah wrote to the people of Jerusalem, to remind them of the many reasons they had to be afraid of God's wrath because of their sins. But God forgives, and because of that forgiveness God's people have no reason to fear.

R Ah, soiled, defiled, oppressing city! It has listened to no voice: it has accepted no correction. It has not trusted in the LORD: it has not drawn near to its God. I said, 'Surely the city will fear me, it will accept correction; it will not lose sight of all that I have brought upon it.' But they were the more eager to make all their deeds corrupt. Therefore wait for me, says the LORD, for the day when I arise as a witness. For my decision is to gather nations, to assemble kingdoms, to pour out upon them my indignation, all the heat of my anger; for in the fire of my passion all the earth shall be consumed. At that time I will change the speech of the peoples to a pure speech, that all of them may call on the name of the LORD and serve him with one accord. From beyond the rivers of Ethiopia my suppliants, my scattered ones, shall bring my offering. On that day you shall not be put to shame because of all the deeds by which you have rebelled against me; for then I will remove from your midst your proudly exultant ones, and you shall no longer be haughty in my holy mountain. For I will leave in the midst of you a people humble and lowly. They shall seek refuge in the name of the LORD the remnant of Israel; they shall do no wrong and utter no lies, nor shall a deceitful tongue





LORD'S PRAYER


Recognizing that the church, and this congregation, are comprised of people from many cultures, languages, and backgrounds, please speak this prayer in the language or version closest to your heart.






The author, Fanny Crosby, composed over 8,000 hymn texts. Included among these are favorites, "Tell Me the Story of Jesus," "Jesus, Keep Me Near the Cross," "Blessed Assurance, Jesus Is Mine," "All the Way My Savior Leads Me," and "Jesus is Tenderly Calling." This great production of hymns resulted from the pen of one blind since six years of age. The above hymn was virtually unknown in the U. S. until it was used in the Billy Graham Crusades from 1954. Besides being a hymn of praise it is also a hymn of grace. The refrain and the first two verses stanzas clearly state that Jesus is the Way of forgiveness and salvation, and that faith is the entrance through the gate of God's grace.

Our Confession about Communion

Our Confession

- 1. Holy Communion is a divinely instituted act in which Jesus Christ gives His true (real) body and blood under the forms of bread and wine. We thus hold that the bread and wine are not mere symbols of Jesus' body and blood. When we receive the bread and wine we receive in fact the body and blood of Christ for the forgiveness of sins.
- 2. We believe that Communion is a celebration of this forgiveness which comes to us through faith as we eat and drink. In communion we remember our Lord's passion and death, His resurrection and ascension, and the promise of His coming again. Communion is truly the Gospel made visible, and is offered for those who "hunger and thirst after righteousness."
- 3. We believe that as we eat and drink this Supper we are strengthened in our faith in Jesus Christ and in our love for one another.

Therefore, we invite to the Lord's Table all who:

- a. have been instructed in the meaning of Communion; have been baptized in the name of the Triune God; have received Jesus Christ as their own personal and living Savior and Lord, and concur in our confession;
- b. are not living in open rebellion against the Word of God, and do not hold willful and persistent form of hatred, resentment or anger against any other person.

Those who have questions about communion are welcome to talk to one of the Pastors.
