People: we are His people, and the sheep of His pasture.


Pastor: Enter His gates with thanksgiving, and His courts with praise!

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION John 1:4

John 1:4-5; Isaiah 52:10

Pastor: Jesus, Word made flesh, You came to dwell among us, but the

darkness of our sin separates and we often fail to bask in the light of

Your presence.

People: We are sinful and unclean; we have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by

what we have left undone. We have not loved You with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We justly deserve Your present and eternal

punishment.

Pastor: John writes in our Gospel lesson, "In Him was life, and the life was the

light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." Heavenly Father, too frequently we live in the darkness

of unbelief.

People: Forgive us, Lord, for those sins we know, and those sins

we do not know.

Pastor: For the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us.

People: Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight

in Your will and walk in Your ways to the glory of Your

holy name. Amen.

Pastor: Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son to be born into this world

and in our flesh for us, to live a perfect life we can never attain, and to give His life as a perfect sacrifice for you. For His sake, He forgives you all your sins. Christ was born to live for us, to die for us, that we by faith will rise with Him in victory. He was born as our Savior to forgive. forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the \(\mathbb{Y} \) Son


and of the Holy Spirit.

Concerning this salvation, the prophets, who spoke of the grace that was to come to you, searched intently and with the greatest care, trying to find out the time and circumstances to which the Spirit of Christ in them was pointing when he predicted the sufferings of the Messiah and the glories that would follow. It was revealed to them that they were not serving themselves but you, when they spoke of the things that have now been told you by those who have preached the gospel to you by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven. Even angels long to look into these things.

HOLY GOSPEL John 1:1–14

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the first chapter.

People: Glory to You, O Lord.

Pastor: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the

Word was God.

People: He was in the beginning with God.

Pastor: All things were made through Him, and without Him was not any thing

made that was made.

People: In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. The

light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not

overcome it.

Pastor: There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a

witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through

him.

People: He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the

light.

Pastor: The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, yet the

world did not know Him.

People: He came to His own, and His own people did not receive Him.

Pastor: But to all who did receive Him, who believed in His name, He gave the

right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of

the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

People: And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we

have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the

Father, full of grace and truth.

Pastor: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

People: Praise to You, O Christ.

NICENE CREED

of the world to come. Amen.


PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

People: Amen.


BENEDICTION Numbers 6:24–26
