Thought for the Day

Make no mistake: if He rose at all it was as His body:

if the cells' dissolution did not reverse, the molecules reknit, the amino acids rekindle,

Let us not seek to make it less monstrous, for our own convenience, our own sense of beauty, lest, awakened in one unthinkable hour, we are embarrassed by the miracle, and crushed by remonstrance.

Adam D. Nevells 15th Annual Memorial Golf Outing & Dinner

In September 2009 Adam Nevells was entering his senior year at OHS as a Varsity Captain on both the Water Polo & Wrestling teams, member of the OHS Marching & Concert Bands, worked with the Okemos Channel, was an Eagle Scout applicant, as well as a Martin Luther Chapel youth member-at-large, all while maintaining a 3.89 GPA. Adam's fatal car crash on September 4, 2009 in front of the High School profoundly impacted our family and our community. The "Adam D. Nevells Memorial Fund" was established in 2009 to give back to the community as well as to keep Adam's memory alive. Since 2009, the Adam D. Nevells Memorial Fund has provided over \$50,000 for individual annual scholarships and grants to the community Adam loved and was so loved by. This includes annual donations to Martin Luther Chapel youth programs (more than \$15,000 to date). scholarships to OHS athletics and music (graduating senior scholarships), and Boy Scout Troop #125. The annual awards are made possible from the fund's annual interest earned. As of March 2024, the fund's balance is over \$138,000. The Annual Golf Outing is the primary source for growing Adam's Fund.
